# Increasing Collaboration, Communication and Creativity in Teams: Applied improvisation

### **Description:**

Applied improvisation is introduced as a tool for psychologists, consultants, and coaches to add to their toolkit when working with teams. Increasingly, improvisation is being applied in organizations to improve team communication, increase collaboration, and ignite creativity. "Yes, and" is presented as a core improvisation approach that has practical implications for increasing team effectiveness. This includes embracing a mindset that supports, affirms, respects others as well as developing a skillset that explores, expands, and builds upon other team members' ideas and suggestions. "Yes, and" is explored as an effective tool for replacing derailing team behaviors with supportive and positive team behaviors.

Three organizational applications for applied improvisation will be discussed: increasing communication, collaboration, and creativity. Implications for increasing psychological safety and uncertainty tolerance in organizations will be touched upon. Presentation goals include providing participants practical tools and suggestions for improving team effectiveness and a "taste of improv" via pre-recorded demonstrations.

This workshop blends didactic presentation with interactive demonstration exercises to supplement participant learning. The three pre-recorded demonstrations include an event planning exercise, a nonverbal mirroring exercise, and a "conducted story," which illustrate "Yes and" principles. Written instructions will be provided with the slides so that participants can apply these exercises in their consulting with teams and organizations.
